6. TREASURERS REPORT

There is an adjustment to the quiz night profit to £220 in 2023.

I do ask that members do bank transfers instead of cheques which cost us 42p each. If you do use a cheque please include clear instructions as to what it is for.

We had issues with HSBC early on in the season and received £100 for our complaint. This covered the cost of bank charges.

Main outgoings this year were the access steps at £1050 but we received 50% of this from PSC. Bowlr costs £500 approximately and we should save a considerable amount if we switch to the Surrey system.

Jane Harding announced that in 2025 Purley Bowls Club will celebrate 120 years and matches will be arranged to mark this. Sutton & District have invited Purley to bid to host a match v The Royal Hospital Bowls Club. Jim Hallams questioned who would pay for meals which will be investigated. John Thurley will present our bid after those present endorsed the idea. Surrey have agreed a 6 rink, mixed match on 22 June.

10. SOCIAL PROGRAMME 2024/5

Dates for the upcoming Quiz (29 November) and Ladies Lunch (19 December) were given to the meeting together with a reminder to attend these fun events. Jim Hallams announced the January 60's event with Alan Lovell entertaining.

11. HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT

Jane Harding issued her report in advance of the meeting, a copy of which is attached. The report was approved unanimously.

12. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT

Miki Aynsley issued her report in advance of the meeting, a copy of which is attached. The report was approved unanimously.

Miki Aynsley informed the meeting of plans for maintenance to be undertaken by PSC, including uprights, paving and flag pole. These will be carried out by end of January 2025.

13. MOTIONS RECEIVED

Proposal to move the end of season meeting forward was agreed.

14. A.O.B.

Club colours: The Ladies section have already agreed that their club colours will be black below the waist. Discussion took place regarding the men staying with white or grey or moving to black. Varying opinions were voiced but after a vote they agreed to change to black by a majority.

Shelter for rink side: Tony Andrews is concerned that we have no shelter replacement for the redundant gazebo. PSC have agreed to give us a pop up gazebo to use next summer. It was felt that a more permanent fixture was needed and the meeting was informed that since the completion of the padel court planning applications, the section could re-approach PSC for such permission to be lodged. Tom Casey suggested asking the council what they would approve prior to us developing drawings. The 2025 committee will take this forward.

Recruitment: Richard Applebee is concerned regarding membership numbers. Jane Harding informed the meeting that a marketing plan is underway and will be given full focus during

the close season. She asks that any member with ideas for such recruitment should approach the committee.

Maintenance: Jane Harding told the meeting that a very positive response had been had to her request for "help". Over the close season various projects will be drawn up by the 2025 committee and implemented. She also mentioned that it was not too late to volunteer.

Change to Surrey booking system: Sean Gallagher asked who would be overseeing the new system as Linda and Tony Gallagher have moved on. Discussion took place whereby some members mentioned other clubs that are already using it. Paul Dobbs offered thanks on behalf of the club for their sterling work in this regard. Jane Seymour outlined the workings and assured members that the new committee would work on making the transition as smooth as possible. A possible paper system may run alongside the new system for a time.

Commonwealth Games:

Conrad de Sousa requested that the Indian Federation have access to our green 14-21 July 2026 to acclimatise to conditions. It was agreed to take this to committee.

Club/locker room cleaning: June Marshall asked what the arrangement for cleaning is between the bowls section and PSC. The committee will investigate.

MANAGEMENT REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT 2024

Following my appointment last November as your Management Representative, I attended my first MMC meeting in January 2024. Unfortunately illness and other issues hampered the frequency of meetings this year. However, despite this, Committee has been very welcoming and it's been good connecting with those from other sections. My hope is that next season we may be able to arrange some inter-section events.

2024 was a year in which PSC undertook some sizeable projects; the long overdue refurbishment of the club toilets and shower facilities, and the construction of two Padel courts. Albeit that Padel has been a major financial investment, it is projected to produce an excellent return. A very promising start is that adult membership is already at full capacity, with a long waiting list. Both Ryan and Chris (Gym) are trying to persuade me to have a go but I'm not sure either my knees or my coordination will allow. However, hopefully some of our bowls members will have a 'Padel'.

Moving onto future works. Repairs to the leaking roof over the squash courts will commence shortly, and there are plans next year to completely resurface the car park. We have put forward a request for additional disabled parking bays.

Regarding the kitchen franchise, Management are currently in discussion with a number of potential candidates. The exact timing of the new franchise has therefore yet to be finalised.

A significant change next year is the plan for PSC to be restructured into a limited company. This will mean the replacement of our existing Purley Sports Club Rules with Articles of Association. This will not only mean a complete review of all club rules, but will also offer the opportunity to update the Club's operational structure. I'll keep you posted.

I'm sure everyone will agree that it's very positive to see the Club's recovery continuing to move forward. This enables essential infrastructure improvements to be carried out, as well as making it possible to consider new projects. At the recent PSC AGM, Peter Bright kindly asked members to be patient as of course not everything can be accomplished at the same time but importantly, future investment projects should be fair to all club sections.

I close with a newflash that the next MMC meeting is in two weeks' time, on 20th November. If you have any questions and/or suggestions for Management, now or in the

future, please do not hesitate to forward these to our Bowls Committee, we will ensure they are taken to MMC and you receive a reply.

Lady Captains Report 2024

Background - I joined Purley Bowls Club in 1999– and this has been my 25th Season.

At the beginning of the Season, we welcomed both Jane Casey and Mandy Power to their first full season and haven't they done well. Despite both being injured at different times they adapted to full membership without any problems. Dorothy phoned me in the closed season and asked how she would go about rejoining Purley- within days it was like she had never been away and it was good to have another 'back end' 'I will play anywhere' bowler in the mix. I do hope that all three of you have enjoyed your season.

I think belonging to the Bowls Club is about having an enjoyable time on the green at all levels. I see my responsibility as Ladies Captain is to make sure that the Ladies have a good time at whatever level they choose to bowl at, try to iron out problems when they arise and do our best to make sure every lady is getting a fair share of the games on offer. I am under no illusion that you cannot please everyone all the time...

The weather had much to answer for this year. We opened two weeks later than intended as the green was very tender, our new Grounds man Ian suggested we let the green rest a little longer. I am so pleased we did – what a lovely green we have had to bowl on despite Summer never really arriving.

Our first Bank Holiday Drive was cancelled due to poor weather but we managed to get some other fun days in and I thank all those who supported these. Despite Captains day clashing with the TLC finals we had a good battle against the men and came second. It was disappointing that the Ladies Captain v Vice Captain and Bowls and Brunch the following day were both poorly attended but these days were tweaked and turned out to be very enjoyable for those who did turn up.

Thanks to our very hard working fixture secretary, Linda, we are now in three leagues and we managed to field teams at all times. The friendlies that were cancelled were cancelled because the opposition could not raise a side. We came third in the CDLL, second in the MSL and won the Cristal League. We came fourth in the Smiths League – This one was difficult to field as so many of our ladies hold Surrey badges and those others who were eligible to play were busy playing other competitions. Ladies I think a decision should be made do we wish to continue with this league?

It was a good move playing most of the MSL games on a Saturday morning. Our opposition seemed to like this too! It allowed workers to take part but as many of these games were at the beginning of the season some of our players were excluded because there were clashes with other Competitions. Nonetheless coming second is a good result in our first season.. Games at the end of the season proved difficult to field and the result of games did not always reflect the strength of the teams.

In the Surrey Delegates report I have mentioned with pride how successful the ladies have been this season in Surrey. We have had success in other competitions, too! I would like to Congratulate both Jane Sanders and Linda Gallagher for making good progress in the National Over 55 singles, Champion of Champions and National Mixed Fours Competitions. They reached Area finals in all these disciplines. I would also like to congratulate Jane Harding on being selected to play for Disability Bowls England South at Leamington. It was a pity that she had to cancel at the last minute through no fault of her own.

It was lovely to see the TLC competitions and the celebration Lunch in September being so well supported by Purley ladies. I congratulate Jane Gibbs and Linda Gallagher for reaching the final of the Aussie Pairs and Ursula for winning the 2-wood competition. I would like to thank Lynn Donovan for all the hard work she has put into the TLC comps since the Borough folded. Lynn told me some time ago that this would be her last season as co-ordinator.. Please think if you would like to take over this role.

I really did enjoy co-ordinating the Internal Competitions this year. Finals weekend was the icing on the cake. The weather was dry and there were some very closely contested matches. Could do better:

- Our beginning of season Bowls Bash and Big Bowls Weekend did not work for Purley 2024. Not many new bowlers joining this season. I will take responsibility for this – I thought it worth a go as both initiatives are supported by Bowls England. The Bowls Bash was particularly troublesome for Elizabeth who emailed BE tirelessly trying to get things moving. I still think the short format game is a good idea and I do believe we can keep it in reserve to use at a later date.
- Despite trying to get selections out in good time, Bowlr selection process was very time consuming and too many of us who are not taking their names out when they are no longer available. I am suggesting that we change to the Surrey system next year. This is run along the same lines as Bowls Surrey Online. John Tucker has shown some of us how this works and I think we would do well to adopt it. In the Match Availability Module there is the facility to withdraw from games. I am not sure that this will make the slightest bit of difference to selection problems but it does put the onus back on the individual. The Surrey System also keeps track of statistics negating the need to keep separate spreadsheets and it is cheaper. I would continue to use the diary in the Clubroom. Still too many who do not do Bowlr and say call me if you are short. Those ladies are not getting their fair share
- A few people have not been picked for half the games they asked for. On closer inspection this is because in some cases bowlers were putting their names down for the wrong type of game
- I am sorry I didn't play many ballots or games. At the beginning of the season I made reasonable progress in the Surrey Singles and Pairs as well as spending 5 Saturdays with the Johns.
- The Past times – It seemed like a good idea at the time to put 2 teams in but it shouldn't be allowed. Well done to Team B for winning against Epsom before being knocked out by Sutton
- Too many things are different between the Men and the women and despite my best efforts there is much which can still be improved.

I would like to thank everyone who holds a post on our Committee for their continued hard work on your behalf. I would also like to thank those ladies who deputised for me when I could not take games. Ursula, Linda, Sue and Janet all stepped up to Captain of the day when asked to. Janet not only managed to create a mixed game between ourselves when the opposition didn't turn up but collected tea and biscuit money when Committee had decided that mixed games would not be charged.
